Healthy Gourmet: Wonderful Pumpkin

Pumpkin Facts

Pumpkin is a delicious, colorful squash containing many nutritious ingredients. Here are just a few:

- Vitamin A vision and immune health
- Vitamin C immune and cardiovascular health
- Vitamin E skin health
- Fiber gastrointestinal health; weight loss, health cholesterol levels
- Potassium nerve and muscle health

Ingredients:

- 2 cups glutton free all-purpose flour
- 2 cups buckwheat flour
- 11/3 cups firmly packed light brown sugar
- 2/3 cups granulated sugar
- 2 tablespoons baking powder
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon
- ½ teaspoon ginger
- ½ teaspoon ground cloves
- ½ teaspoon nutmeg
- ½ teaspoon baking soda
- 1 cup melted butter
- 1 14 oz. can pumpkin
- 2/3 cups milk
- 4 eggs
- 2 cups semisweet chocolate chips

Glutton Free Pumpkin Chocolate Chip Muffins – (makes 2 dozen)

Directions: Heat oven to 360 degrees. Grease 24 muffin tins. Combine all dry ingredients, except chocolate chips, in a large mixing bowl and evenly disperse with a whisk. Combine all wet ingredients in another bowl and blend until combined with a whisk. Add wet ingredients to dry ingredients and stir just until combined. Quickly stir in chocolate chips and spoon into muffin tins. Bake for 20 – 25 minutes or until firm and beginning to brown.
