Public Policy

Now that election season is upon us, it's time to think about what we value in a candidate. And it's time to encourage everyone who is eligible to vote to make sure they are registered.

AAUW Action Fund provides Quick Fact Sheets on several of our priority issues, to include Reproductive Rights. In the most recent edition, the Action Fund lists various 'attacks on Reproductive Rights'.

- Affordable Care Act Restrictions. The law requires insurance companies providing abortion coverage to collect two payments from each enrollee: one for the portion of the premium covering abortion care, and one for the remainder of the premium. Additionally, members of Congress have targeted many of the Act's tax provisions to limit women's access to abortion coverage.
- Constant Legislative Attacks. Members of Congress have attempted to roll back reproductive rights. One example is mandating parental consent for minors receiving reproductive health services.
- Personhood Initiatives. Anti-choice activists have attempted to elevate the status of a fetus under federal law, undermining women's right to choose. Personhood initiatives have been on several state ballots.
- Court Challenges. Anti-choice advocates are actively seeking cases to send to the Supreme Court to weaken Roe v. Wade.

Public Policy (Continued)

There are several policies that Congress could enact to improve women's health and reproductive rights:

- Improve Public Funding for Reproductive Health. Increased Title X funding will improve women's access to basic health care and reproductive health care services.
- Invest in Medically-Accurate, Age-Appropriate Comprehensive Sex Education. Programs must include information about both abstinence and the full range of contraception.
- Support International Family Planning. Federal funding for comprehensive international family planning programs benefit millions of women worldwide.
- Ensure Access to Contraception and Emergency Contraception. In many states, pharmacists can refuse to fill contraception prescriptions if they have a religious or moral objection.

As you are talking with your neighbors and friends about important issues facing our candidates, keep in mind what AAUW advocates. Check out the AAUW websites which contain invaluable information. And, of course, help to <u>Get Out the Vote</u> by participating in voter registration drives.

Hope to see you all at the AAUW Candidate Forums on March 24 and April 7. Remember that even local elected officials can influence policy and funding to support areas of concern for women and families.

Peas offer many health benefits. Fresh peas are easy to grow and readily available all year round. Fresh, frozen and canned peas:

- ✓ contain many antioxidants and anti-inflammatory nutrients that lower risk of heart disease, type 2 diabetes and arthritis.

Cajun Chicken Paella

Ingredients

Pollo Asada
Pkg Chicken Andouille Sausage – sliced
Yellow Onion – diced
Red Bell Peppers – sliced in strips
Pkg Frozen Peas
Cup Fresh Cilantro
15 Oz Can Diced Tomatoes – undrained
½ Cup Brown Rice
Cup White Wine
½ Cup Chicken Stock
Tony Cachere's Cajun Seasoning – to taste
Tablespoons Olive Oil

Directions

Sauté onion and peppers in olive oil in a large sauce pan or electric skillet for 5 minutes. Add sliced sausage and chicken and brown for 10 minutes. Add cilantro, peas, rice, wine, stock and Tony's. Stir then simmer for one hour or until rice is done.
