# Public Policy

At our April general meeting, we hosted Hazel Davalos from CAUSE (Central Coast Alliance United for a Sustainable Economy). She presented some very interesting and sometimes disturbing information regarding the working conditions for our local residents who work in the fields, especially for women laborers. The report is a result of a survey taken by more than 300 farmworkers. I am sharing with you a press release from CAUSE regarding their Farm Workers Bill of Rights. You will be seeing more about this if they are able to get the item before the Board of Supervisors.

"Farmworkers do one of the hardest, most dangerous and most underpaid jobs in our community. The people who put food on our tables deserve human rights and dignity!

Too many farmworkers face daily abuses like extreme overwork, wage theft, and health and safety risks. Harsh labor conditions can often include exposure to toxic pesticides, working in the fields while pregnant, limited access to clean bathrooms and drinking water, unpaid and stolen wages, not receiving 10 minute rest breaks, sexual assault, injuries without compensation, intimidation and retaliation for filing complaints or speaking up.

We urge the Ventura and Santa Barbara County Boards of Supervisors to pass a Farmworker Bill of Rights that would set and enforce the most basic protections for workers in our fields.

The Farmworker Bill of Rights, developed by local community organizations and farmworker advocates, uses the powers of the local county government to:

1) Curb extreme overwork by ensuring workers get real rest breaks with 10 minutes to use water, shade and bathrooms and preventing farmworker women from losing their jobs for taking time off during pregnancy.

2) Crack down on wage theft by hiring county staff to help with investigations of unpaid wages, increasing penalties for violations, and establishing an anonymous hotline for complaints.

3) Protect health and safety by providing health and safety education for farmworkers, inspecting farms for access to clean bathrooms, helping growers who want to transition away from harmful pesticides, and aiding victims of sexual assault.
