

Public Policy

Last Monday, the Supreme Court made history by overturning the Texas law (HB2) designed to close 75% of the state's abortion clinics by forcing them to meet the costly standards of surgical centers.

While this is a huge legal victory for women's reproductive rights, unfortunately the political battle isn't over - not at all.

AAUW members need to consider a vote for prochoice candidates in 2016. Newly appointed judges could overturn Roe v. Wade and criminalize abortion, sending ob/gyns to jail for murder - and possibly their women patients too.

Many state and local politicians are even fiercer in their opposition to abortion. They could vote to cut funding for Planned Parenthood, harass clinics, and coerce women into forced childbirth, even in cases of rape and incest.

AAUW supports reproductive choice and access to good reproductive health care for all women. There are several political races in our area where candidates hold certain views which are counter to AAUW policy priorities. Please ask these candidates about their views, look at their voting records, and vote accordingly.

AAUW is non-partisan but we do publish a review of voting records. Just google your candidate and search for how they voted on issues related to women's health and pay equity.

What is the AAUW Fund?

The AAUW Fund is a general fund for unrestricted gifts, which are used when and where they are most needed. This prevents overfunded and underfunded areas that keep AAUW from reaching our full mission potential. By donating to the AAUW Fund, you are helping incubate and grow our highly successful, community-based, mission-driven programs, such as Tech Trek and Tech Savvy, Start Smart and Work Smart, Elect Her, the Legal Advocacy Fund, the National Conference for College Women Student Leaders, the AAUW National Convention, research, and other initiatives.

In the past, AAUW's national membership dues covered the costs of managing and running mission-based programs. Though membership numbers have remained steady the past several years, membership dues have remained the same, and program costs have risen annually. AAUW national membership dues cover just 30 percent of the funds needed to support the mission-based programs and advocacy efforts that are fundamental to AAUW's ongoing effectiveness.


