From Pat's Desk...

With all the great programs and fun we have at branch level we sometimes forget that we are part of a much larger organization. AAUW has been empowering women as individuals and as a community since 1881. For more than 130 years, we have worked together as a national grassroots organization to improve the lives of millions of women and their families.

At the AAUW-CA annual meeting I learned some interesting facts about our state and national organizations. At the state level we receive support with publicity, communications, and advice about fundraising activities to ensure that IRS regulations are followed. The state administers our insurance and provides leadership development. The Public Policy Committee has taken an important role in establishing our Policy Priorities and working with our lobbyist to review and analyze new legislative bills. State Projects Oversight committee looks after Tech Trek and Speech Trek and any new projects that may be developed. As Tech Trek migrates back to the states this committee will play an important role in how Tech Trek moves forward.

At the national level, AAUW awarded \$3.7 million in fellowships and grants in 35 countries in 2016. There were 200,000 messages sent on behalf of AAUW to state and federal legislators. 50 top U.S. researchers convened with AAUW to discuss advancing women in engineering and computing. AAUW has publications that we have provided to our local elected officials on the "gender pay gap", but also

many more on subjects such as Sexual Bias, Women and Student Loans, and STEM education. There are many videos and webinars available on the national website that range from how to organize a "get out the vote" event to "Using Inclusive Language to Create a Welcoming Space". Our national organization is truly a voice for all women through public policy initiatives and the legal advocacy fund. Check out the AAUW website and you will be amazed at the information that is available to us.
