On August 26th we celebrated Women's Equality Day to commemorate the passage of the 19th Amendment which secured women's right to vote on August 26, 1920. This was a historic step for women's equality and the day a time to celebrate the women who fought for the right to participate in the democratic process. It is also a day to acknowledge that the amendment did not further the equality for all women. Women of color routinely face racism within the suffrage movement. State laws and racial discrimination continued to keep women of color from voting. It wasn't until 1956 that any Native American could vote in Utah and black women remained effectively disenfranchised until the civil rights movements of the 1960s.

AAUW continues to support public policies that are important to issues of concern for women and girls including pay equity, family leave policies, and equity in education and the work place. Our membership in the organization helps influence these policies and lets our voices be heard.

Critical Upcoming "Every Member" Vote Voting period: September 10 – October 1, 2017

How to vote:

- Members with an email address will receive a link to vote online.
- Members without an email address will receive a postcard with instructions on how to vote online or via telephone.

Vote topic:

• Approve changing AAUW California's status from a *Mutual Benefit to a Public Benefit* entity.

Why vote: We risk losing our affiliate status with AAUW National which would mean we would no longer be a recognized AAUW entity and as such would no longer be eligible to participate in any AAUW programs, such as Tech Trek.

Question Period: Now until September 9, 2107. • Direct all questions to <u>governance@aauw-ca.org</u>.

WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN A MUTUAL BENEFIT AND A PUBLIC BENEFIT NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION?

Mutual Benefit:

Members of a Mutual Benefit corporation can receive distributions from the organization and receive the assets of the organization if it is dissolved, similar to shareholders of a for-profit corporation. Mutual Benefit Corporations typically qualify under 501(c)(4) or 501(c)(6).

Public Benefit:

All assets must be irrevocably dedicated to a charitable purpose and as such, there are no distributions to members of the organization on dissolution or otherwise. Public Benefits corporations generally qualify for federal tax exemption under 501(c)(3) and sometimes 501(c)(4). Full details can be found on the home page of <u>www.aauw-ca.org</u>
