AAUW Convention 2015

Cathy Trevino and I attended AAUW Convention 2015 in San Diego June 18-21. We took the train with AAUW members from San Luis Obispo County, Santa Maria and Santa Barbara-Goleta Valley. The enthusiasm and excitement were high and we had great conversations on the way!

We heard fantastic speakers at plenary sessions, attended motivational workshops, celebrated our successes and vowed to continue working on Title IX civil rights issues, pay equity, women's health issues and encouraging women to take leadership roles and run for public office—just to name a few! We started early and ended late each day, but what fun it was!

We hosted a table on our award winning programs on "Human Trafficking" at 7 am and ran out of handouts! Who knew so many AAUW members would rise so early to learn more about Mission Based Programming? We loved talking about our November and April meetings, of course!

And we learned the results of our national election! Every two years, AAUW's national election offers members the chance to share their opinions on proposed amendments to the AAUW Bylaws and Public Policy Program, as well as to select the members of the national AAUW Board of Directors. The 2015 election was a great success, with 12 percent of our members voting — more than double the 5 percent quorum required by our bylaws.

We elected: **AAUW President**, Patricia Fae Ho; **AAUW Vice President**, Alicia Hetman; and **Directors**, Susan Barley, Malinda Gaul, Eileen S. Hartmann, Ellie Hill, Traci Jensen, Melissa Johnsen, Dot McLane, Rebecca Norlander, Glenda D. Price, Pam Thiel. All of the proposed AAUW Bylaws amendments passed except for elimination of the degree requirement for membership. AAUW membership will continue to require an Associates' degree or higher.

Public Policy

The recent Supreme Court decision on the Affordable Care Act supports the AAUW priority position of a strong health care system for all people. Hopefully, this decision regarding the ACA will once and for all settle the legality of the law. Women are especially concerned that the ACA is not used as a political football. According to AAUW, "the ACA, the health care reform law enacted in 2010, has had significant impacts on women's health.

- It ends the practice of "gender rating." Gender rating is the process by which insurance companies charge men and women different premiums for individually purchased health care plans. Under the ACA, gender rating was banned for plans offered in both the individual and small-group markets (defined as organizations employing 100 or fewer persons) beginning in 2014. Unfortunately, insurance companies may continue to pursue this discriminatory practice under plans offered in the large-group market.
- It requires coverage of women's reproductive health services. While AAUW supported this
 coverage in the ACA, unfortunately the law also required insurance companies providing
 abortion coverage to collect two separate payments from each enrollee: one for the
 portion of the premium covering abortion care, and one for the remainder of the
 premium itself. This could endanger women's health care access.
- It ensures access to and coverage of preventive services and care. The law contains a specific women's health provision under which insurance companies will be required to cover additional preventive health care and screenings for women such as contraceptives, mammograms, gestational diabetes screening, and pap smears at no additional premium or co-payment cost."

Another significant Supreme Court decision supports an AAUW priority issue, equal rights. The SCOTUS majority voted to legalize marriage for all Americans. I like President Obama's quote: 'Love is love''. It's that simple.
