AAUW Speech Trek

The Lompoc Vandenberg Village Branch is sponsoring Speech Trek this year, a speech contest for all High School students with the topic: How Can We Stand Up to Sexism? What can I do as an individual, what can organizations like AAUW do to break down stereotypes and biases in school, in the military, at work, and in our communities?

Our branch is inviting all actively attending high school students (all genders) to participate in the AAUW Speech Trek Contest. The deadline for the students to sign up to participate is Friday, December 8, 2017. Contact Pam to obtain information and required consent forms. There are AAUW members, some local teachers, and volunteers who will be available to mentor students as they prepare their speeches, and practice presentations.

Students will prepare and present a 5-6 minutes speech responding to the topic: How Can We Stand Up to Sexism?, to the AAUW Lompoc-Vandenberg Branch members, judges, and public attendees. Prizes (to be determined) will be awarded to the top three local winners, and each student will receive a certificate of participation.

The Speech Trek Contest will be held Friday, January 26, 2018 at 3:30 pm at the Lompoc City Council Chamber in City Hall, 100 Civic Center Plaza. The competing students will be videoed, and the local first place winner's presentation will be sent, via YouTube, to AAUW CA State judges. From the videos entered into the State competition, two contestants will be named as Honorable mentions and receive \$250 as the 4th place winner, and \$150 as the 5th place winner. The top three State level finalists will be invited to compete for cash prizes at the AAUW CA State Convention/Annual meeting to be held on Saturday, April 28th, 2018. The First-place winner at the State context will receive \$1500; Second-place winner at the State contest will receive \$1000; and -the Third-place winner at the State contest will receive \$500. The top three state level finalists and a chaperone will have travel expenses, lodging, and meals reimbursed by AAUW Speech Trek (not to exceed the approved budget).

A press release has been sent to The Lompoc Record and S Y Valley Star on November 14th.

We have teachers from Lompoc High, Cabrillo, Maple High and Santa Ynez Valley Union High on board.
