



From Pat's Desk...

I hope all of you are having a nice summer. Dianne led our planning meeting on June 16 and the group came up with some excellent ideas for programs and other actions. Pam and her committee will be on their way to another great program year. We won't be having a general meeting in July, but do look at the events calendar for what is being planned in August and September.

Our votes in May/June on the three proposed amendments to AAUW national bylaws resulted in the passage of only the first proposal, which was to make national board terms staggered. The other two proposals to allow non-AAUW members on the board and to remove the degree requirement for membership did not pass. It is interesting that only about 20% of eligible members voted—it was a very easy process of just going on-line to your membership page.

AAUW national also makes it very easy for you to contact your elected representatives on matters of interest through their two-minute activist program. It is unclear whether Congress will be taking any action on immigration reform, but this is certainly a topic of interest to many of us. AAUW advocates for the civil and human rights of all immigrants, including a fair and just path to legal status. June 10th was the 55th anniversary of the Equal Pay Act. In 1963, women made 59 cents for every dollar a man made. Currently, the average gap for all women is now 80 cents on the dollar compared to all men. While strides have been made, there is still work to be done. One way is to empower women themselves to negotiate their own financial futures. As one major stride, this year, AAUW set a goal of training 10 million women in salary negotiation through Work Smart workshops by 2022. Our own Mary Beth has given this program at Allan Hancock College and hopefully will be able to offer it again.

I look forward to seeing you at future programs or events.

Public Policy

On June 27, 2018, AAUW Chief Executive Officer Kim Churches released the following statement after the announcement of Supreme Court Justice Anthony Kennedy's retirement.

"In recent terms, the Supreme Court has weakened many protections that are critical to the equity of women and girls, including decisions rolling back employment discrimination laws and labor rights, undermining reproductive health choices, and gutting voting rights. With the retirement of Justice Kennedy, we are at a crossroads. The U.S. Supreme Court is the arbiter of so many of our most fundamental rights and the next justice will be able to have a say in the health, education, and economic security of women and girls for decades to come. Therefore, it is crucial that Justice Kennedy's successor be a fair-minded and independent jurist who understands that his or her decisions have a very real impact on the daily lives and decisions of women and their families.

So much of the work of AAUW in fighting for gender equity hangs in the balance with this Supreme Court vacancy. Any nominee must be the result of meaningful bipartisan consultation, fully vetted by the Senate, and held accountable for any record of bias. We urge all senators to ensure our next Supreme Court justice has a clear reputation for fairness and independence and values equality and inclusion."

We, as AAUW members, need to work hard to get out the vote. We need to look at candidates'

voting records and make sure we elect people at all levels who support a woman's right to choose. When women are not allowed to control their own reproductive health, they can hardly achieve equity in the workplace. As we get closer to the November elections, this column will include source information for voting records.

On another note, AAUW members need to do whatever it takes to support the 'Families Belong Together' movement. Voice your outrage by contacting your members of legislature and insist that vulnerable children are not taken from their parents as they cross our borders seeking asylum. Return those children now in detention centers to their parents immediately. Seeking asylum is not a crime.
