AAUW Speech Trek Contest - February 8, 2019

The Lompoc-Vandenberg Branch is hosting its second annual Speech Trek competition; open to all enrolled high school students in Lompoc, Santa Ynez, Buellton and Solvang areas.

The timely topic for the Speech Trek contest is: "How can we - students, parents, faculty, our communities and organizations such as AAUW - eliminate violence aimed at our schools? What actions can we take to prevent another tragedy from taking place?"

Speech Trek committee members are hard at work scheduling information visits to high school classrooms, seeking funding and organizing volunteers for mentoring, workshops and participants for the event on February 8, 2019, at City Council Chambers.

Please contact our Speech Trek Coordinator, if you would like to participate as a student mentor or volunteer in any capacity. There is opportunity to donate snacks/waters for student workshops and the event.

Of course, donations are always appreciated - whether it is the gift of your time, materials, or cash to support the cost of the event. Coast Hills Credit Union has notified our Branch that they will cover the \$500 in divided awards for the top three placements. A generous (anonymous) community member has donated \$200, a \$50 member donation was received and Lompoc's March for Our Lives has pledged \$250. Greater funding will allow for an increased number of workshops at City Council Chambers, TAP TV, increased student outreach (posters/flyers/snacks), and the possibility of sending a student to the AAUW State Speech Trek competition in San Diego.

Public Policy

AAUW California Public Policy Priorities support our mission and provide the basis for action and advocacy. This year they are reviewing our priorities and making changes to guide AAUW California in 2019-2021. The Public Policy Committee will draft new priorities which will be adopted by a vote of AAUW California members in the spring of 2019.

Your feedback is important and you are encouraged to complete the online survey. The survey lists the priorities and provides an opportunity to agree with the current statements or to offer

suggestions for changes. The deadline for completing the survey is December 10. You can take the survey at <u>https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/WRTYKH5</u>.

Priority Topic A:

To achieve economic self-sufficiency for all women, AAUW CA advocates:

- 1. Pay equity, fairness in compensation, benefits, and economic justice.
- 2. Equitable access and advancement in employment, including vigorous enforcement of employment anti-discrimination statutes.
- 3. Strengthening retirement benefits and programs, including pension improvements, and protecting Social Security from privatization or reduction in benefits.
- 4. Programs that provide women with education, including financial literacy, training, and support for success in the workforce.
- 5. Strengthening programs that encourage career development and earning potential, including career and technical education, access to post secondary education, and welfare job training.
- 6. Policies that promote and support work-life balance, including child and dependent care.

Priority Topic B:

To support a strong system of high-quality public education, AAUW CA advocates:

- 1. Adequate and equitable funding for high-quality public education for all students, including preschool.
- 2. Increased support for programs that break through barriers for women and girls in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) fields.
- 3. Protection of programs that meet the needs of girls and women in all levels of education, including sexual health education.
- 4. Vigorous enforcement of Title IX and all other civil rights laws pertaining to education.
- 5. Opposition to the use of public funds for nonpublic elementary and secondary education, and for charter schools that do not adhere to the same civil rights and accountability standards as required of other public schools.
- 6. Support for and adequate funding that gives women and disadvantaged populations access to higher education, including two-year degree programs and vocational training.

Priority Topic C:

To guarantee equality, individual rights and social justice for a diverse society, AAUW CA advocates:

- 1. Self-determination of one's reproductive health decisions.
- 2. Freedom from violence and fear of violence, including bullying, sexual harassment, human trafficking, and gun violence, in all aspects of life.
- 3. Increased access to quality, affordable healthcare, and family planning services.

- 4. Strengthening California programs, including affordable housing, that improve the lives of children in families living at or below the poverty level.
- 5. Support for United Nations programs that address human rights and women's and girls' issues.
- 6. Freedom in definition of self and family, and guarantee of civil rights for all family structures.
- 7. Vigorous protection of and full access to civil and constitutional rights for all.
