Your AAUW Local Scholarship Committee, as in past years, wishes to take this opportunity to keep you advised of our activities and to thank you for your support during the past year. We welcomed new member Cyndi and thanked departing members Gail and original member Carol Ann for their efforts on the Committee.

Thanks to your support we were able to award two \$1,000 scholarships to a graduate from both Cabrillo and Lompoc High Schools. To be candid we were short \$221 but a last-minute donation was received which closed the gap.

Kristen graduated from Cabrillo High School and will be a freshman at Long Beach State University to pursue a career in Physical Therapy. Logan from Lompoc High School will be a freshman at U.C. Berkeley and her goal is to be a Physician's Assistant.

To continue our search for additional funding we contacted two local wineries who in the past have hosted our wine tasting event with the hope that they would host us a second time, but we were not successful. However, thanks to Julie who spoke to the owner of Montemar Winery, we have a host. WE ARE GOOD TO GO AT MONTEMAR on Sunday afternoon, September 22nd. The exact time will be announced. Steve has set a maximum of 32 servings. As in previous years our charge is \$30 which includes snacks.

We have not sent a letter of solicitation to our members in the last two years, in the hopes that the wine tastings would provide sufficient funds to maintain an adequate balance in the AAUW Scholarship account, and this year we almost came up short.

Legislative Action Alerts are one of our key advocacy tools. Individual members sign up to receive alerts and, when State directs that grassroots action is needed, an alert is sent out to the list of subscribers. We are just entering into the period where more voices will be needed on pending bills. You can sign up for Action Alerts on the national website, which automatically will also sign you up for the state website. You will also receive national Action Alerts on federal issues. AAUW's messaging reflects our long-standing commitment to issue-based advocacy for policies that empower women and girls. Our positions are on policies, not parties and politics.

The U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit blocked a nationwide preliminary injunction that would have temporarily stopped the Department of Health and Human Service's Title X "gag rule." The rule, which prohibits providers that receive Title X funding from discussing abortion with their patients, can now go into effect while the litigation is pending. AAUW opposed these regulations, and both AAUW of Hawaii and AAUW of California also submitted comments in opposition.
