Update from AAUW California

Governor Signs 12 AAUW-Supported Bills Into Law

The 2018-19 legislative season has come to a close, and by October 13, 2019, Governor Newsom signed 870 bills out of the 1,042 bills that were presented to him. Among the most significant of these were twelve bills which will become law due to the advocacy and research support offered by AAUW California.

What is the Five Star Recognition Program?

The AAUW 5 Star Recognition Program for Fiscal Year 19-20 is underway for Branches and States. Branches can earn stars in Programs, Advancement, Communications & External Relations, Public Policy & Research and Governance & Sustainability.

Here is how the Lompoc-Vandenberg Branch can earn 5 Stars by June 30, 2020!

- PROGRAMS: Host 3-5 strategic plan-related programs (e.g. Forum on Economic Security, Work Smart Online Training Day, Operation Equity: Reading for Results participation, panel on Women and Leadership), Branch completes the Community Resource Mapping Exercise.
- ADVANCEMENT: \$30 per capita (member) gift raised for Greatest Needs by December 31, 2019, Shift focus to AAUW Fund from fellowships and grants/LAF to Greatest Needs, Retain 90% or more of branch membership & submit annual dues by September 30, Increase Legacy Circle members in branch by 10%.
- COMMUNICATIONS & EXTERNAL RELATIONS: All existing websites and social media presences include an Economic Security Focus and Work Smart Online. (Monthly posts are required for social media; Work Smart Online must be included on website home page,)
- PUBLIC POLICY & RESEARCH: Conduct an annual meeting with U.S. representative(s) and/or state legislators around a strategic plan area of focus, Branch Public Policy Chair is appointed who collaborates with CA Public Policy Chair, Host at least one public event where Action Network sign-ups are collected.
- GOVERNANCE & SUSTAINABILITY: Align planning with CA AAUW and AAUW national strategic plans, Branch Board institutes a succession plan to ensure new ideas and perspectives are included in future branch leadership.
