AAUW Releases Gender Agenda for 2020 Election Urges federal and state candidates to commit to policies protecting women's economic security

With the election season moving into high gear, the American Association of University Women (AAUW) has released its 2020 <u>Gender Policy Agenda</u>, which outlines the organization's top priorities for advancing the economic security of women and their families.

"Women make up the majority of American voters, and we have the power to ensure that all the candidates pay close attention to the policies that directly affect our lives and the lives of our families," said Kim Churches, AAUW's chief executive officer.

"While we are a fiercely non-partisan organization, we are not values neutral: Throughout our 140year history, we have advocated for laws that improve the lives of women and girls—and we'll continue to do so.

"We urge all candidates for state and federal office—regardless of party—to commit to these priorities. We also ask *every* American to stand with women and to cast their vote in what is arguably one of the most consequential elections in our nation's history," Churches said.

Olivia, a senior at Dunn High School, won first place and \$250 in the third annual AAUW Lompoc-Vandenberg Branch Speech Trek contest held at Lompoc City Council Chambers on January 31, 2020. Yazmin took 2nd place - \$150 and Edgar placed 3rd and received \$100.

The YouTube video of Olivia's speech will automatically be submitted to AAUW CA to be judged at the state level.

High school students from the mid-Santa Barbara County area (Lompoc, Buellton, Solvang and Santa Ynez) were invited to participate in the AAUW statewide competition. In conjunction with the 100th anniversary of the 19th Amendment, seven students presented meaningful speeches on the topic: "Are men and women truly equal today, or are the Suffragettes of 1920 still suffering in 2020?" The other participants were: Isabella, whose speech included an original poem, Victoria C., Joseph and Victoria G.

The students presented their speeches to the public and to a panel of community leaders who served as judges: Robin Ghormley, Chief of Public Affairs, 30th Space - State of the Wing at Vandenberg AFB; Claudia Ortiz, Youth Development Director of the Lompoc Family YMCA; Dr. Lynne Portnoy, visiting physician at Lompoc Health; Jim Throop, City Manager at City of Lompoc; Aaron Crocker, co-owner of Grocery Outlet, and alternate judge Ben Walters, Production Controller, Missiles 581st MMXG at VAFB.

Mayor Jenelle Osborne presented the awards and certificates of participation to the students. CoastHills Credit Union was the gold-level sponsor for the total of \$500 in cash awards. Additionally, The Bookstore and Lompoc Foursquare Church were gold-level sponsors this year, contributing \$500 each to make the contest possible, along with AAUW member donations and multiple fundraisers.
