



From Pam...

As we proceed in the 57th year of our Lompoc-Vandenberg Branch, CA in the days of COVID-19, I'm thinking about the year 1964 when the Branch was formed, and the social unrest, inequalities and injustices during that time. I'm thinking that the mothers of our Branch founding members were born before any woman in the United States had the right to vote. I'm thinking about my own Grandmother Hessie, who turned 14 years old in 1920. Once she was able to vote, she never missed showing up at the polls. She talked to her grandchildren about how important it was to vote and do well in school. Her education ended at 4th grade, as she had to stay home and take care of her younger siblings in rural North Carolina. The rights and education of women and girls were not considered important by most in those days. I'm grateful that she lived to be 84 years old and knew that all six of her granddaughters had graduated from college.

Our Branch was formed just eight years after all Native peoples were given the right to vote in 1956, and it could be said that all in our Country have the right to vote - but can they? It is most distressful to be aware of the facts that, in 2020, voter suppression is as real today as it was in Jim Crow days. Watching the documentary "13th" gives insight to the history of voter suppression tactics. The news today tells the stories of polling places being removed to effectively disenfranchise voters in many areas, as well as efforts to block voting by mail. As AAUW and other organizations continue to fight for equality and equity in education, jobs, women's reproductive health rights, healthcare, and life in general, there is a lot of work to be done!

My first responsibility is to remind everyone who has not renewed their membership to please do so. Our year runs through June 30 and, as of June 25, only 39 of our current 91 members had renewed. You can renew in one of two ways. The easiest for everyone is to go online at www.aauw.org and go to the Membership selection on the right hand side of the main page, then enter the Member Services Database (MSD). You will need your member number and password to log in. Once you are in MSD, you will see a box that contains a "Renew my Membership" link, click that and use your credit card to pay your dues. If you do not want to do that, mail a check to AAUW, P.O. Box 2523, Lompoc, CA 93438 and Leslie will process your payment. Dues are a total of \$99 for the year (\$59 for National, \$20 for State, and \$20 for Branch). Please remember if you are a life member you still need to pay State and Branch dues. I appreciate your attention to this and your continued support of AAUW at all levels.

Thanks to quick work by the 2020/2021 program team last week (thanks Pam, Julie & Marell!), an exciting calendar of programs, included below, is set for 2020/2021. The program topics were selected on the basis of alignment and relevance to AAUW's mission and strategic plan, along with subjects of high relevance/impact to the community. This is an outstanding way to become involved in our branch's impact.

Most meeting venues are being planned this year to be *virtual* to protect our members and the community who may be in a high risk for COVID-19 category. If there is a vaccine and new guidance, which would allow an in-person venue, we'll adjust accordingly.

The year will kick off in August with a conversation facilitated by AAUW with a panel of subject matter experts addressing *Implicit Bias* which is front and center for us at the national, state and local levels. In September and October, once again AAUW will host a series of nonpartisan *Candidate Forums* for the Lompoc community: Lompoc Unified School District School Board Candidates, City of Lompoc City Council Candidates, City of Lompoc Mayor Candidates and State Assembly District 35 Candidates.
