As I write this note for the October 2020 newsletter, Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg — The Notorious RBG — weighs heavily on my mind and in my heart. Where would we be today if she had not persisted and prevailed? How do we march on in a way that both honors her and keeps the light burning bright for equality, equity and justice for EVERY PERSON? As I rewatched the documentary on RBG, I looked back at my life in 1976 when my nursing supervisor informed me that I shouldn't expect to make as much as the male nurses: they were the providers (What about me? I was my sole provider). And in 1980, as I was expecting my first child, a different nursing supervisor didn't approve my welldeserved raise because: "You are going to have a baby and probably won't come back to work." This quote from the September 21 AAUW Action Network email sums things up: "With heavy hearts, we mourn the loss of over 200,000 Americans to COVID-19. Along with those lost to the pandemic, we also grieve the passing of Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg. We hold her memory as an inspiration to continue her life's work: fighting for gender equity and representation everywhere. For now, to honor her, the most important thing you can do is vote."

Our Branch continues the long-standing community service of sponsoring preelection forums, this year with financial support from The Fund for Santa Barbara. Lucy Thoms-Harrington, Program VP, and committee have been working for many weeks preparing for the October 1 forum featuring the Mayor/City Council candidates, and for the October 8 forum with the LUSD candidates. These forums are 100% virtual in keeping with AAUW's COVID-19 guidelines, requiring mastering of the skills of Zoom, grant writing (Lucy), coordination with the many candidates, City Hall, TAP TV and a professional Spanish interpreter.

Tech Trek

I have just received this announcement from AAUW CA:

Yesterday, AAUW National announced that in the 2021 season, Tech Trek camps in all states must be delivered on a virtual platform.

This decision was made due to the many unknowns and changing regulations, which are happening so rapidly that in-person events cannot be advised this far in advance.

They also advised that all states should delay student recruitment until further into 2021.

As announced in prior communications, since the cancellation of our 2020 season, California Tech Trek has been working on alternative solutions, which include a fully tested virtual platform option designed and implemented by our UC San Diego camp director. In addition, our delay of the student selection process to January 2021 aligns with the National decision.

While this announcement is certainly a disappointment, but not a surprise given the pandemic still actively impacting our country, the California Tech Trek Program leaders are fully prepared to continue the Tech Trek tradition by providing selected campers with a stimulating, fun and rewarding STEM virtual experience.

Rest assured that when the time is right, our goal is a return to the residential Tech Trek camp model that, since 1998, has been AAUW California's premier STEM camp legacy.

Thanks to your support, our branch is ready to start the selection process in January 2021.
