August Recap: Phenomenal Response to Implicit Bias Program

100 people! 100 people registered to attend our first program of the 20-21 year: *Implicit Bias* with Mr. Eric Abrams, Chief Inclusion Officer, Stanford University School of Graduate Education. Along with local AAUW members and state leadership, a wide cross-section of the community of all genders and colors attended this impactful virtual program via Zoom. Community members included foundation CEOs, business leaders, LUSD executive team members, President of AHC and team, airmen from VAFB, faith leaders, service organization leaders, activists, educators, and high school and college students. Feedback from this program was overwhelmingly positive. Many thanks to our new member, Hope, for securing Mr. Abrams as our dynamic speaker on this important topic.

AAUW recognizes we have work to do in expanding the diversity of our membership. One step in the journey is offering programs which stretch and grow our organization and the larger community.



October: It's the Season - VOTE, VOTE, VOTE!

We have two programs planned for October which put AAUW's words and values into action:

"AAUW is committed to open and fair elections, nonpartisan voter education efforts that will promote equitable political participation and representation in appointed and elected office, and the expansion of voting rights." https://www.aauw.org/resources/policy/position-voting-rights/

We originally planned to offer three Dual-Language Virtual Candidate Forums on the most impactful races to our community: the 35th State Assembly District Candidate Forum, the City of Lompoc City Council and Mayor Candidate Forum, and the Lompoc Unified School Board Candidate Forum, which were generously sponsored by The Fund for Santa Barbara.

Scattered Seeds

35th State Assembly District Forum Update: Last week, Dawn Addis, the challenger for the 35th State Assembly seat immediately accepted the invitation to participate in the AAUW Forum, while Jordan Cunningham's office (35th district incumbent) informed AAUW that he declines to participate in the AAUW Forum.

Our Forum team convened yesterday, August 31, 2020, to discuss the plan forward. We reluctantly decided that, since only one candidate would be able to participate and to protect the non partisan position of AAUW, we would not be able to go forward with this particular forum. Instead, AAUW will focus all efforts on the two non-partisan races in Lompoc: the Lompoc City Council and Lompoc Mayor Candidate Forum, which is planned for Thursday, October 1, 2020, from 7 to 9pm and the Lompoc Unified School District Candidate Forum, which is planned for Thursday, October 8, 2020, from 7 to 9pm. Ballots will be mailed on October 3, so our forums are perfectly timed to inform and encourage early voting.

There is no charge to attend the forum(s) but registration is required. Check our website in <u>mid-September</u> to register for the forums. To motivate early registration, awesome AAUW face masks will be given to the first several people to register for each forum. Masks are made by a local seamstress through The Bookstore

Thanks to a generous grant from The Fund for Santa Barbara, for the first time AAUW will be hosting all forums virtually via Zoom, in **Spanish and English**. The forums will be simulcasted live by TAP TV on radio and TV. The dual-language Zoom webinar format will allow greater access to the forums from our entire diverse community. Registration will be required and



participants will be able to pose their questions in advance at the time of registration. Topic areas for each forum have been selected. Candidates will be advised of the topic areas in advance, but not the specific questions which relate to the topic area. A Question Team will select the specific questions based on those received from the community and input from the team.

To further expand access, the forums will be recorded and posted on our website, so that the community unable to attend live will be able to view the forums at a time convenient with their schedules.

Many, many thanks to our hard-working City Forum team, which includes: Marell, Alice, Mike, Elena, Janet, Pam and Barbara B. A separate team is convened for the LUSD School Board Forum. Want to be part of these cool teams? We are looking for <u>experienced Zoom users/hosts</u> to join us and work behind the scenes to make the magic happen, timekeepers and Question Team members. Here is how to have your vote count this year: rolled into one neat package from SB County Elections webpage (https://countyofsb.org/care/elections/voting/vote-safely.sbc). Tell your folks to tell their folks to tell their friends to tell their neighbors to tell the whole of all of us:-). Included on this link:

Ballot Tracker - Tracks your ballot as soon as its mailed to you. All ballots will be mailed this year due to COVID-19 (regardless of whether you signed up for vote by mail or not). If you don't receive it by October19, ask for a replacement by calling the Registrar of Voters at (800) 722-8683 or (800) SBC-VOTE.

My Voter Status - Tracks your ballot from mail to receipt. Use this if you send in your ballot by mail (mail early so your vote is received on time).

Ballot Drop Off - Drop off your completed ballot day or night up to 11/3/20 @ 8:00 pm at the official County Ballot Drop-Off Box located at Lompoc City Hall as you pull straight in the lot.

Poll Workers Needed - Earn extra cash and be a great citizen. Paid poll workers are needed. High school aged + above. Apply on the page.

Polling Hours - For the first time, all polling places will be open **3 days before election day**. Sat 10/31 & Mon 11/2, from 8am to 5pm; Tues 11/3 - Election Day, from 7am to 8pm.

Polling Places - You can <u>drop off your completed ballot</u> at any of these places in **Lompoc**. If you want to drop off your ballot at the polling place in real time, you'll need to go to the polling place assigned by your residence (on your ballot):

Public Policy

Covid-19 has affected every aspect of our lives and the effects will certainly be evident the first week of October, when voters will start receiving their mail-in ballots for November's Presidential Election. As you are likely aware, Governor Newsom has ordered that every registered voter be mailed an absentee ballot for the upcoming election. So voters won't have to choose between exercising their right to vote and staying safe and healthy in the midst of this pandemic.

While many of us in Santa Barbara County routinely vote by mail, there are tens of thousands of voters in our county for whom the process will be entirely new and strange. So the groups who "GOTV" (Get Out The Vote) have their work cut out for them. If you or anyone you know has concerns or questions about the process, please visit the following website: https://www.sos.ca.gov/elections/voter-registration/vote-mail/.

Registration deadlines, in case you have moved or want to change party designation, are as follows: (Did you know the American Independent Party was formed by George Wallace when he ran against President Kennedy in 1960? If you want to register outside of any party, choose 'No Party' in Section 8 of the registration form.)

- Election day is Tuesday, November 3, 2020.
- The deadline to register online to vote is Monday, October 19, 2020.
- The deadline to register by mail to vote is (postmarked by) Monday, October 19, 2020.
- The deadline to register in person to vote is Tuesday, November 3, 2020. Conditional voter registration is a safety net for Californians who miss the deadline to register to vote or update their voter registration information. Voters can use the conditional voter registration process from the day after the deadline all the way through Election Day. Eligible citizens can go to their county election office, polling place or vote center to register and vote conditionally. These ballots will be processed once the county elections office has completed the voter registration verification process.
- All registered voters will automatically be mailed a vote-by-mail ballot for the November 3, 2020, General Election.
- The early voting period runs from Monday, October 5, 2020 to Monday, November 2, 2020, but dates and hours may vary based on where you live. While AAUW does not endorse candidates, we view voter education as an important responsibility, so watch for our upcoming candidate forums!

Stay safe and healthy! Wear a mask! Wash your hands! Stay 6 feet apart!
