It's been quite an unusual year for everyone. Who would have thought that our group would be meeting on Zoom and not having some of the activities that we had all come to enjoy. "AAUW ELECTION RESULTS: MEMBERS HAVE SPOKEN

Many thanks to everyone who voted in <u>AAUW's 2021 National Election</u>. It took a mere three days to reach the required quorum—a testament to our members' passion and engagement.

Julia Brown and Malinda Gaul were re-elected as board chair and vice chair respectively, and Elizabeth Haynes and Joseph Bertolino will retain their board seats.

AAUW's public policy priorities were approved by 92% of voters. The board-recommended ballot initiative to remove the college-degree membership requirement did not receive the two-thirds vote required to enact a bylaws change. However, a remarkable 63% of you voted in favor of this change, indicating a momentum shift toward a more inclusive membership.

While we have many voices, all AAUW members share a commitment to advancing gender equity for women and girls through research, education and advocacy. More than ever, we must embrace our values and continue to strive towards <u>diversity</u>, <u>equity and inclusion</u>; it's a journey that will never end."

I'm sure everyone received the above newsletter from national. Having missed the opportunity to expand and diversify our membership by only 3% was extremely disappointing. I believe our organization could benefit massively from the stories that potential, but presently excluded, women could share with us about how to expand gender equity.

Of course, as I have stated many times, until women have the absolute right to control their own bodies, even in Mississippi, we will always be unequal.
