Graduating to Debt

Student debt is making it nearly impossible for many women to afford their basic living expenses after graduating from college. According to the just-released 2021 update to AAUW's Deeper in Debt, women graduates are left with a mere \$148/month when you subtract loan debt and a few standard living costs from the average entry-level salary. Adding in child care results in a \$372 deficit.
