Nancy Morales is an Indigenous Latinx feminist scholar-activist, whose project examines Indigenous women and queer youth's participation in building diasporic Indigenous communities to challenge U.S. settler colonialism. She is also a cofounder of Collective of Pueblos Originarios in Diaspora (CPOD), a new student campus organization that heightens visibility of Indigenous students (Maya, Mixtec and Zapotec) in diaspora at the University of California, Santa Barbara. Her goal is to pursue various forms of scholar activism.
