Human Traffficking Prevention Program

On May 9, AAUW presented our local programs and highlighted two of its three top legislative priorities of AAUW which are aimed at holding Social Media Platform companies accountable for their roles in contributing to the dramatic rise of on line recruitment of minors for human trafficking using their Platforms. The town hall was hosted by the Lompoc Rotary and AAUW was joined by Lompoc Unified School District, the city of Lompoc, the Lompoc Police Department and other community leaders on this critical issue. More than 40 people were in attendance to learn about the dangers surrounding the use of Social Media and human trafficking.

Date and Time: Saturday, August 12, 6:30 pm dinner, 8 pm play


