Date and Time: Saturday, August 12, 6:30 pm dinner, 8 pm play



The End of Reproductive Choice in Red America and the Supreme Court

I write this on the one-year anniversary of the Dobbs Decision handed down by the Supreme Court overturning 50 years of guaranteed access by all women in the country to reproductive care.

"In the year since Roe fell, 20 states enacted laws banning or restricting abortion, forcing a rapid shift in our country's patchwork of abortion access. At least 61 clinics, Planned Parenthood facilities and doctors' offices stopped offering abortions in the last year. Most were in the 14 states that banned abortion outright." New York Times

Many states already have a shortage of OBGYNs and medical schools report a significant decrease in the number of students signing up to study the speciality of gynocology which is another scary result of these bans and restrictions.

This situation is unacceptable, un-American, misogynistic and wrong-headed. I predict that the election in 2024 will go a long way toward correcting these horrible bans and restrictions. I am

counting on a surge of young voters who will help get our country back on track for women's healthcare.

AAUW stands firmly behind reproductive choice and was instrumental in the passing of CA Proposition 1 last November which amended the Constitution of California to explicitly protect the right to abortion; it was among the first three states do so, alongside Michigan and Vermont.
