I was delighted that so many of us were able to attend the first general meeting of the new year which preceded the terrific Pedal the Pacific community reception program on July 17, attended by over 100 people.

Like many of you have also shared with me, I too left inspired by the work done by the Pedal Team of 10 female college students from across the country. They shared their stories of spending the summer biking the 1700 miles from Seattle to San Diego to raise awareness and support for the fight against human trafficking. AAUW is proud to stand shoulder to shoulder with these women and with the vital work done by the North County Rape Crisis and Child Protection Center, the host and our collaborator on the event, led by its indefatigable executive director, Ann McCarty.

For our part, AAUW shared with the audience its advocacy of one of the highest legislative priorities of AAUW CA State Assembly Bill 1394, which would hold social media companies accountable for their platforms' roles which are used to attract and recruit victims by traffickers. We will continue to advocate for the support of this bill.

25 Years of Tech Trek


