Central Coast Discussion: AAUW School Board Project



Across America, a movement is underfoot to allegedly "protect our children" from hearing, reading, or learning about the struggles of marginalized groups and our government's role in creating and/or responding to those challenges. Books are being pulled off shelves and curriculum is being censored on a daily basis. These efforts include financial and other forms of support for candidates for school board positions who support these policies and who would then be in a position to see them come to fruition.

These policies are antithetical to AAUW California's public policy priorities to ensure "equal access to quality public education for all students" including "access to diverse curriculum that represents historically accurate information." This is why AAUW California is determined to do everything we can to stop this movement from taking hold in our beautiful state, and why we have entered into a collaboration with Equality California to identify, recruit, and support candidates to run for nonpartisan school board races up and down the state.

Our 2023 Tech Trekers shared their camp experiences with our branch and community members at our August 20th meeting. The girls were eager to share. I hope you saw the article in the September 20th Lompoc Record highlighting them. I am including their thank you notes below.

Thank you so much for raising the funds to send me to Tech Trek! The whole experience has been amazing. It gave me the opportunity to learn many new facts about how to investigate crimes and solve mysteries. As well as a deeper understanding of the marine wild life off the coast of California, and how to code a program. Over all, I think that this program has broadened the horizon for many campers.

I was assigned Forensic Science for my core class, which is something that I hadn't thought much about. The class covered many different aspects of being a forensic scientist, and it was very interactive.
