AAUW Funds

We are nearing the end of the donation year for AAUW Funds. As of now, 15 of our members have sent in donations via the online access. Please consider making a donation by using the AAUW links listed below. If you are not comfortable doing it online, you can send me your check made out to AAUW Funds and I will send them to the national office. Here are recommendations from State.

- 1. Online Donations via the Community Hub: One of the simplest ways to contribute is directly through our Community Hub. So long as you are making donations to the AAUW Greatest Needs Fund you can make use of the Renewals and Donations function to contribute. Just fill in the donation amount by member without clicking anything related to renewing to process just those contributions. If you would like to donate on behalf of your branch or to other funds, however, consider one of the other two options.
- 2. Express Payment Link: If you prefer a more direct approach, consider using an Express Payment Link. This method doesn't even require you to be logged in! Simply provide the national staff with the donor's name, donation amount, and the desired fund, and they will create an order on your behalf. Following this, you'll receive a link to finalize the transaction with your branch's preferred payment method. This method will allow you to donate on behalf of your branch, to other funds besides Greatest Needs, and for multiple people. Email connect@aauw.org with 'Express Payment Link' in the subject for assistance.
- 3. Contribution Report Form: The Contribution Report Form is another viable option but not as efficient as online methods. A leader (Marell) can fill out the form, which can be <u>found here</u>, to send in either individual checks by the donor or a check written by the branch for multiple donors. Be sure to follow the instructions associated with the Contribution Report Form and mail in donations using a *trackable* method. While we encourage branches to explore the above online options first due to potential post office delays, this method remains a suitable choice for those encountering issues with the online platforms.
- 4. Individual Retirement Account (IRA) Thinking of making a year-end contribution from your IRA? Federal law allows people aged 70 1/2 or older to make direct transfers up to \$100,000 per year per person to charitable organizations from their IRA, without the withdrawal being treated as taxable income. To start first contact your IRA custodian and follow their procedures to request a "Qualified Charitable Distribution." The check sent must be accompanied by your name and address information in order for you to receive a written acknowledgement from national. Please provide the recipient information below to your custodian, along with our Tax ID #52-6037388. Before sending, please also notify us at planned-giving@aauw.org so we can keep an eye out for your gift and be sure to include the amount, your name, address, the designation of your gift (for example: Greatest Needs), and the financial institution sending your gift. Please direct your check, drawn on your IRA account and made payable to AAUW, to: AAUW
