## **Programs & Events**

#### Pedal the Pacific

Over 90 people attended the Pedal the Pacific Lompoc Community Reception hosted by the North Country Rape Crisis and Child Protection Service Center in collaboration with AAUW. Pedal the Pacific 2024 is a team of seven female college students who bike the 1700 miles from Seattle to San Diego to raise awareness for the fight against human trafficking. At the program, Kay (Duffy Taylor) shared AAUW's legislative advocacy work which includes sponsoring CA Assembly Bill 1394 which will go into effect Jan. 1, 2025. This law, this first of its kind in the nation, requires a court to award statutory damages between \$1 million and \$4 million for each act of commercial sexual exploitation that social media platforms "knowingly facilitated, aided or abetted".
